Report Record Street Home

Frederick, Maryland

As we look back on 2025 here at Record Street Home, the word change comes to mind. Although the Home is still a life care facility for women of at least sixty-five years of age and is the only one of its kind in Maryland still able to operate as a private institution, the Home has seen many transformations in its management personnel and resident population this year.

In July, Kevin Quirk, our first and only General Manager, retired after 30 years of faithful service and has been mentoring our new Assistant General Manager, Kevin Grubb. Kevin “G”, as he is known by the staff, retired from the Frederick City Police Department with outstanding qualifications and the ability to repair almost anything and solve problems that inevitably arise from a physical facility like ours.

Kevin G works closely with the Admissions Committee explaining our financial requirements to potential residents and their families and presides over the contract signing when a new resident moves in. He also prepares a yearly budget, and a detailed monthly report which he presents to the Board of Managers.

Our Board of Trustees, who manage the financial assets of the Home, also saw a change in leadership as well. Bob Hooper who served as President for 8 years passed away in September. The Trustees are now led by Gerry Baker Hicks, daughter of long time Board President, Joseph D. Baker. They continue to work with the Board of Managers in a two tier management structure rooted in the 1892 charter of the Home.

The 26 member Board of Managers has been led most efficiently for the past two years by President Connie Mason. This group of women is still the major force in determining the Home’s character. Managers are to become involved with its activities and concentrate on the residents. They attend monthly meetings, help with social functions, visit with the ladies, and become an integral part of the Home.

Tracy McGuirk continues to be our Director of Resident Services. She not only assists new residents before they move in, but helps them adjust to their new home. She becomes their friend and confidante and is a problem solver with her excellent skills and “can do” personality. She is in charge of housekeeping and the kitchen. She plans activities to entertain and stimulate the ladies and attempts to keep everyone happy and the Home running smoothly – no small task.

Continuing to serve as our Director of Nursing is Michele Rindone, RN. She and her competent staff render exceptional care to each of our ladies. Michele evaluates each resident when she applies for admission and along with Dr. Brendan Henderson, the Home’s physician, decide which living area within the Home is best suited to the new resident’s need. We are most grateful for the exemplary effort of all the staff to protect and care for our ladies

A Day in the Life of Our Ladies

Record Street strives to have a family atmosphere, one of excellent medical care with dignity and love where residents can spend the remainder of their lives without financial or housekeeping burdens. A resident is offered many activities in which to participate, but the choice is always hers to make. She may join activities either as an active member or as a stellar cheerleader depending upon her interests. No two days are exactly alike, but here we mention some of the many choices available to our residents:

8 AM - Breakfast in the Dining Room

9:30 AM - Light and Lively – morning exercises lead by our Director of Resident Services – Tracy McGuirk

10:00 AM - Activities such as Corn Hole, Wii Bowling, Rescue Mission Service Project, Reading with Dr. Edward Thompson, or various activities with our monthly managers including trips to the Frederick Fair or special events in the community, or walks in the park. Thursdays are reserved for our favorite beautician – Kim Remsburg – who makes the ladies look beautiful.

12:00 PM - Noon Day Meal in the Dining Room

2:00-4:30 PM - Activities Time – Monday –
Bells Wednesday – Bingo (always)

Other day activities with Monthly Manager or Tracy – may include, but are not limited to, Great Decisions, sing alongs with Ginny and Peg, art classes, movies, shopping trips, happy hours, guest speakers, flower arranging and many more.

5:00 PM - Light Supper in the Dining Room

6:00 PM – until... - Book Club once a month, game night, travel logs, musical groups and lively conversation.

Weekends - Second Saturday with various activities and always delicious desserts arranged by Sandy Corridon, bonus bingo, therapy dogs, visits from family and Board of Managers, musical performances, both in the home and in the community.

There is also quiet time where residents may spend time in their rooms, reading, watching their favorite TV shows, listening to music or just relaxing. The ladies

may also use the beautiful parlors to visit with family or friends or to chat with each other.

Admissions Committee

Admissions Committee oversees the application process for potential residents. Generally, the first introduction to the Home is a tour, often followed by a meeting with the General Manager, to discuss the financial arrangements. If the tour results in the desire to move in, an admissions packet is given. The applicant completes three sections of the application: general information, a health evaluation by the applicant's physician, and a financial disclosure form. These three forms are submitted together. The General Manager evaluates the financial information. The Director of Nursing, in cooperation with our concierge Home Physician, reviews the medical portion.

If the financial and health sections are satisfactory, the Admissions Committee meets with the applicant to get acquainted with the candidate on a personal basis. Following this meeting, the Director of Nursing administers a cognitive evaluation. If the cognitive evaluation is satisfactory, the applicant makes an appointment with our home physician for a physical. The Director of Nursing and the Home Physician determine the section of the home best suited to the applicant, and she may choose her room accordingly.

We ask that the furniture be moved in over a weekend to minimize disruption to the residents and staff, and to have the time to arrange the room into a personalized spot for the resident. During the following week, she signs the paperwork and moves in physically as a resident on probation. She has six months to evaluate her

decision before becoming a permanent resident. All the steps in the process prevent regret for both the home and the resident. They also insure our ability to care for each resident to the standard of excellence for which we are known.

The Admissions Committee enjoyed giving 15 tours during 2025. These tours resulted in 4 new residents. Lillie Byrd moved in in March. She is the 7th of 9 children and was born in Prince George's County. She enjoyed helping to raise her grandchildren and worked at Byrd Tire in Hagerstown. She is dedicated to walking her 'laps' to keep fit. Alice Fisher is the third sister in her family to live at Record Street Home. She was a telephone operator and says she 'loved it'! She retired from Fort Detrick as a GS-12. She is never seen without a ready smile. Elfa Halloway moved in in November. She was born in what is now Poland and has lived in both Europe and the United States. She worked in the German Embassy in London and as a legal secretary for law firms in Atlanta and Washington, D.C. She likes to read and has joined the book club. Betsy Carter moved in December. She was born in Washington, D.C., when her parents worked for FDR. She worked at a credit union. She likes to sew and read and often leaves her door open for anyone passing to say hello.

Lillie Byrd and Jackie Grimes became permanent residents in 2025. We are fortunate these ladies chose Record Street Home as their community and 'family'.

Entertainment Committee

Sunday June 1st was our annual Strawberry Festival and this year our ladies were able to invite 2 guests each to join them for a light meal. The party took place in both the dining room and activities room and once again the strawberries from Mountain Valley Orchard did not disappoint.

Friday July 11th an early Retirement Party was held for Kevin Quirk. Renaissance Catering provided light fare in the dining room and Kevin was presented with a beautiful framed water-coloring of Record Street Home painted by Margaret Huddy.

December 14th found the big sisters and little sisters gathering in the activities room after the private sharing of Christmas gifts with the little sisters in their rooms. Everyone enjoyed refreshments in the activities room before making their way into the parlor for Christmas carols and a delightful visit from Santa.

Thursday December 18th was the staff Christmas party held at the Frederick Presbyterian Church. The staff enjoyed a variety of sweet and savory nibbles as well as sparkling beverages. Each staff member was gifted a poinsettia along with an attached \$10. Sheetz gift card.

Game night was suspended for a bit this year due to lack of interest but when we did gather it was always fun and having board member participation made for a good time.

Finance Committee

Our committee has several tasks to complete throughout the year. Kevin Quirk and Kevin Grubb prepared a draft budget for 2026. After review by the Finance and Executive Committees, the budget was presented to the Board in November and approved in December. The 2026 budget includes a 3% increase for all staff. This wage increase allows our employees to keep pace with the economy. We also approved and distributed a holiday bonus, our normal practice, to reward a dedicated staff. In addition, we distributed gift certificates and notes of thanks to the hard-working nurses and aides.

The Board of Managers approved a small increase in the monthly allotment given to residents to cover costs such as beauty parlor, stamps, etc. The new allotment is \$150. This \$10 increase is in addition to a larger increase given in 3 previous years. The residents receive this allotment prior to the first of each month.

We did not mail the Mother's Day Appeal letter in the spring; however, funds are needed for the extensive renovation of the activity room to be completed in 2026. A letter will be mailed to previous donors and funds will be used toward this renovation.

Memorial donations for the year were \$8,150. General donations totaled \$5,300. We received \$518 from the United Way.

Home Exterior and Garden Committee Dianne Martz

The Home Exterior and Garden Committee continues its

maintenance and preservation of the Record Street Home.

There were seven major exterior projects:

1. Installed security fence and gate on south side of park side building.
2. Repaired columns on the Bentz Street side of Parkside building.
3. Repaired the window sill on the Activity room side of Baker wing.
4. Replaced cement slab at the base of the fire escape on South side of Parkside building.
5. Repaired the retaining wall on South side of Parkside building.
6. Enlarged the existing back patio.
7. Added a large planter to the back patio to honor the memory of Louise Talley, a dedicated member of the Board of Managers.

Dottie Lenharts's daughter, Lori Winn, donated flats of annuals for the garden planters and garden. The residents started zinnias and marigolds for the walkway to the garden shed.

Ginny Brace continues to maintain the bird feeders outside the activity room.

As always the garden is continually changing and is a quiet place to enjoy the company of friends and family.

Interiors Committee

The Interiors Committee began 2025 by completing a final clean-up of the attics and basement, including the removal of several more items. Nursing supplies stored in the attic were organized, labeled, and placed in clearly marked containers.

An inventory of mattresses and beds in the Baker and Parkside units was completed in collaboration with the Director of Nursing, resulting in the recommendation that several items be replaced. It is recommended that mattresses be replaced as needed and checked yearly.

In May, the Committee began discussions regarding the renovation and updating of the Activity Room. Recognizing that the scope of this project exceeded the committee's expertise, Interiors by Design was engaged. Based in the City of Frederick, the firm brings specialized experience in working with healthcare facilities. Several meetings between the designers and the Committee have taken place, and the project is anticipated to be completed in early 2026.

External Relations Committee

The External Relations Committee registered Record Street Home as a vendor in the 2025 Elder Expo held at the Frederick Health Campus on October 8 and 9. Hundreds of Senior Citizens attend the free event and collect information on home care, legal services, nursing and assisted living communities, health services, downsizing, end of life planning and more. Participating in this event is an excellent opportunity to talk to community members about the mission of Record Street

Home. Our display board has photos of our Residents enjoying their life at Record Street Home.

Contact was made this year with the Elder Services Provider Council which holds a monthly networking meeting with a speaker. The meetings represent a coalition of community and government agencies interested in senior services.
